

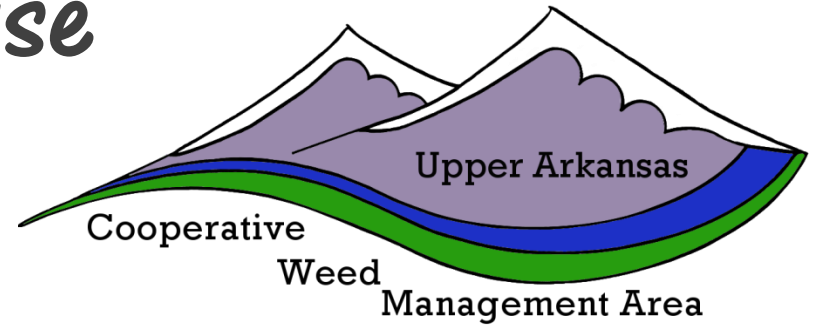

-How do I know my pasture is in good condition?

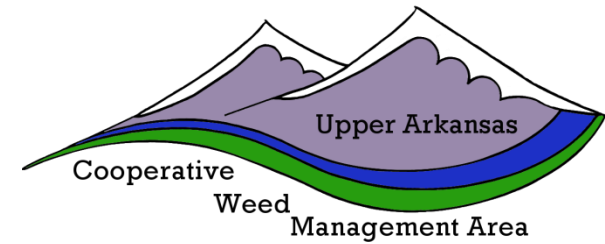
